
FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

EARLY LEARNING COLLABORATIVES

UWNI used Preschool Development Grant funds in 2020 to conduct needs assessments and develop strategic plans for Bonner and Kootenai Counties to improve early childhood systems and outcomes. In 2021 we secured over \$1 million to implement these locally-driven action plans through local Early Learning Collaboratives, and invest in youth success programs throughout our 5-county region.
